Secretary's Report

BLUE RIDGE DISCOVERY CHAPTER BUSINESS MEETING

President Money welcomed new members Frank and Corrine Miller from North Carolina, Steven and Margo Whitaker from Georgia, and Talis and Helen Chalk from Pensacola, Florida.

Secretary's Report:

Secretary Linda G. Terrill included the report of the Seffner, FL rally at Lazy Days RV Park in the Blue Ridge Discovery Newsletter on 03/19/2018. President Money asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes. There were none. Mike Hopkins moved to accept the minutes as distributed. Bill Humphreys seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Mike Hopkins sent the Treasurer's Report and Financial Statement as of 03/31/2018 to the Blue Ridge Discovery Members on 04/06/2018 showing a balance on hand of \$12,279.08. This balance includes the Savannah, GA and Bowling Green, KY rally fees already submitted as well as biennial dues fees. No rally expenses were submitted for the Savannah, GA thus far, so none were included in this report.

President Money asked if there were any corrections for the report. There were none. Tom Leydic moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Dick Tracy seconded the motion. The Treasurer's Report was approved unanimously.

Nominating Committee Report:

Jim Pinkerton discussed the nominating committee. He asked all the members to consider volunteering to be Rally Master. Rick Blaher volunteered to be Rally Master.

Jim said he would send the ballots out electronically to formally elect the officers.

Rally Master Report:

There are potential tours being scheduled. Kerry discussed the surplus stores in the area as well as a lot of activities.


Dear Blue Ridge Discoverys Members:

Sick Call

I know I'm late posting this, but life and anesthesia sometimes gets in the way. Had the surgery on May 16. They removed the esophagus and pulled a piece of the stomach up to make a new one. This has a similar effect as Bariatric sleeve and made my stomach smaller. Have to eat 6 small meals a day, starting with soft foods. I'm eating well, but 6 meals is a lot.

The surgery went well, but recovery not so good. I had the pain reliever that I could push the button and administer myself. I don't remember, but evidently I'm a drug woos. I ODD on it and had trouble breathing. They gave me NARCAN and took away the good drugs. I stayed in severe pain because they were afraid to give me any narcotics.

They said the minimum stay was a week, so I told them that's what I wanted. I had to walk, eat without the feeding tube and get the plumbing removed. They removed the chest drains individually, the catheter, the crap up my nose, the IV and the oxygen. I still have the feeding tube, but I'm not using it. Got home on May 23, and after a few hours of discomfort, have settled in. Taking half doses of Oxi and skipping some doses completely. Walked around farmers market yesterday and went to church today. I tire easily and nap more than usual. Next milestone is follow up with surgeon when they'll remove the feeding tube.

Update: Pat had a little hiccup last weekend and went to ER. Spent a couple of days in hospital and had esophagus dilated so he could swallow. That's why they left the feeding tube in. May have to do it again but I'll skip ER trip.

Update. I had my follow up with the surgeon at Emory Hospital. He removed the feeding tube!!! And said that my progress report was the best it could be. No signs of cancer. I will have CT scans every 3 months for a while. The hole from the feeding tube should heal in a couple of days. Then I can start working out and running, slowly. Even though it left a sore spot, I am really glad to get rid of that tube.

Thanks for all the thoughts, prayers, and well wishes. My faith is greater than my fear. (Pat Stanton)

Jean and Richard Money are "holding their own" as Richard likes to say. Jean is on a new chemo drug (infusion) that she goes to Duke for 2 Wednesday's in a row and then I get a week off. The 2 weeks on are okay (if you call a trip to the ER ok) but the week off is very good. Her oncologist is encouraged, she thinks that Jean's voice is stronger indicating that the tumor on the vocal cord is shrinking and the paralysis of the cord is less. They hope she is right, Jean prefers not sounding like she has laryngitis 24/7 if possible! Jean and Richard are taking it day by day, whatever comes their way. Richard is wonderful and takes very good care of Jean.

The Money's are planning a trip to Fredericksburg - it's her week off and should be good if all goes as planned. It seems like for ever since Jean has seen any of you guys!

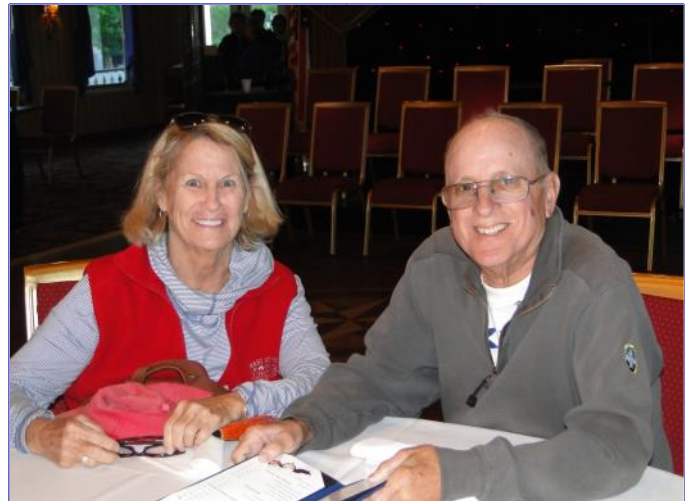

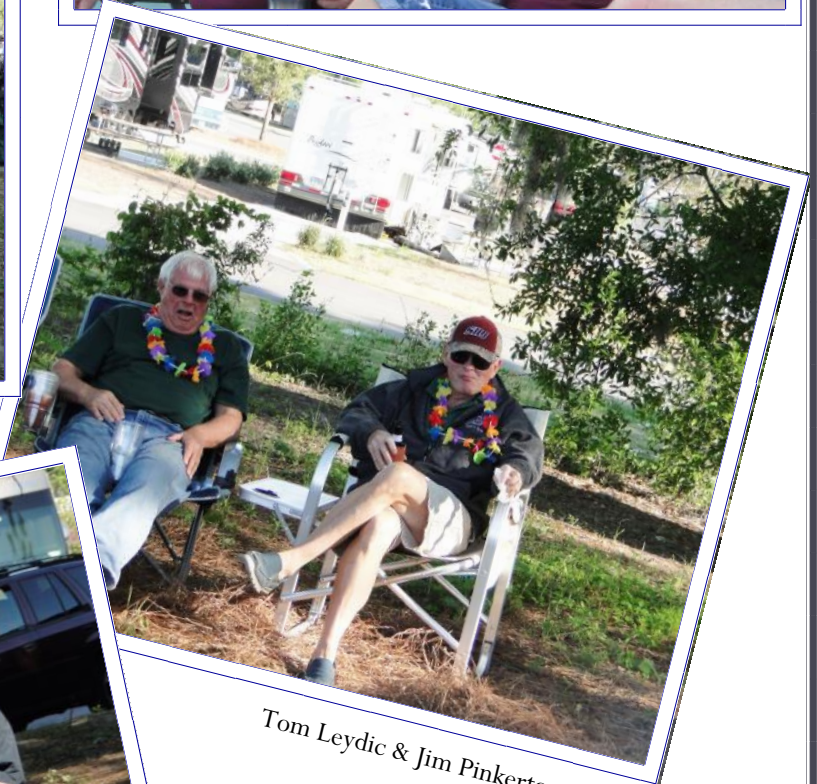

ASIAN CUCUMBER TOMATO SALAD

Makes 5 Cups

Ingredients:

1. 6 mini, seedless, cucumbers, quartered lengthwise, cut on bias in 1/2" pieces.
2. 1 pt. sweet cherry tomatoes, halved
3. 1 cup spicy, citrus, ginger sauce (or as close as you can come with OTC salad dressing)
4. 1 Tbs. white roasted sesame seeds
5. 1 tsp. salt
6. 2 Tbs. chopped cilantro

Add all ingredients to a large bowl. Toss to combine. Total time: 15 minutes.



LOBSTER ROLLS

Fills 4-6 rolls

- 4 Lettuce leaves
 - 1 ½ Pound cooked and cubed lobster meat
 - 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
 - 1 teaspoon fresh lime juice
 - 1 dash hot pepper sauce (e.g. Tobasco)
 - 2 green onions, chopped
 - 1 stalk celery, finely chopped
 - Salt & pepper to taste
 - 1 pinch dried basil, parsley or tarragon
- Lightly butter the insides of the buns or rolls and line with lettuce leaves Set aside

In a medium bowl, stir together the mayonnaise, lime juice, hot pepper sauce, salt and pepper until well blended. Mix in the green onion and celery, then lightly mix in the lobster so it just gets coated without falling part

Stuff the lobster filing into the buns and sprinkle parsley, basil or tarragon lightly over the filling. Time 15 Minutes

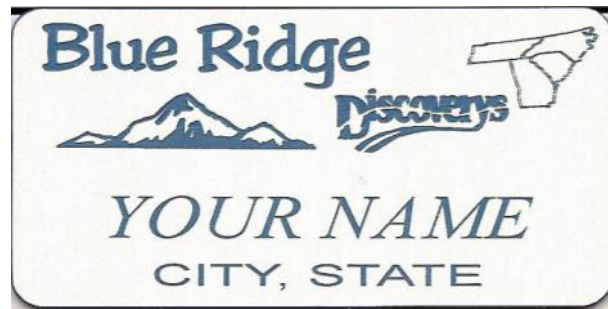
